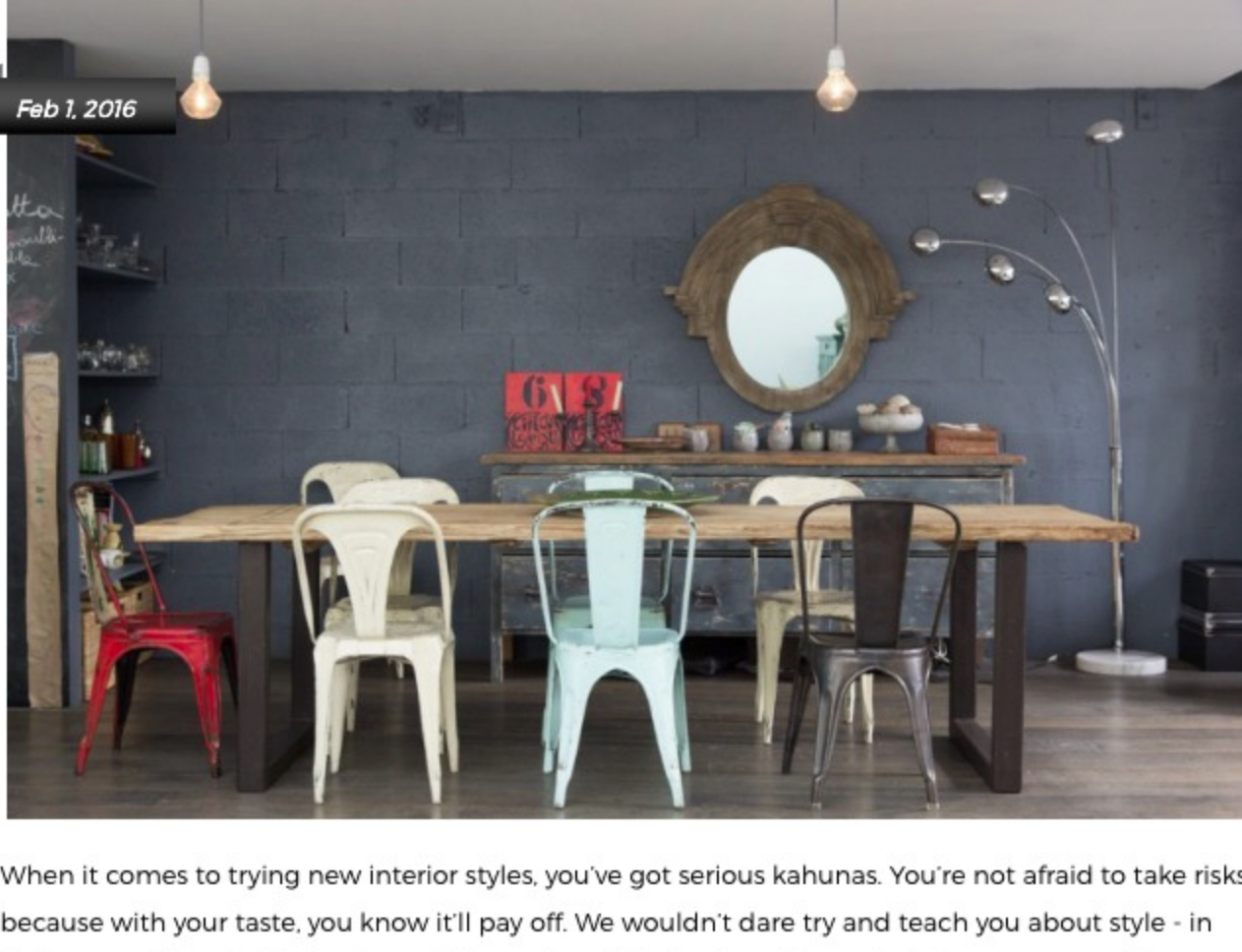


## 6 looks for confident decorators. Novices - look away.

We recommend putting a chaise in an unloved corner or a bay window. Complete the look with an oversized plant or a little side table.

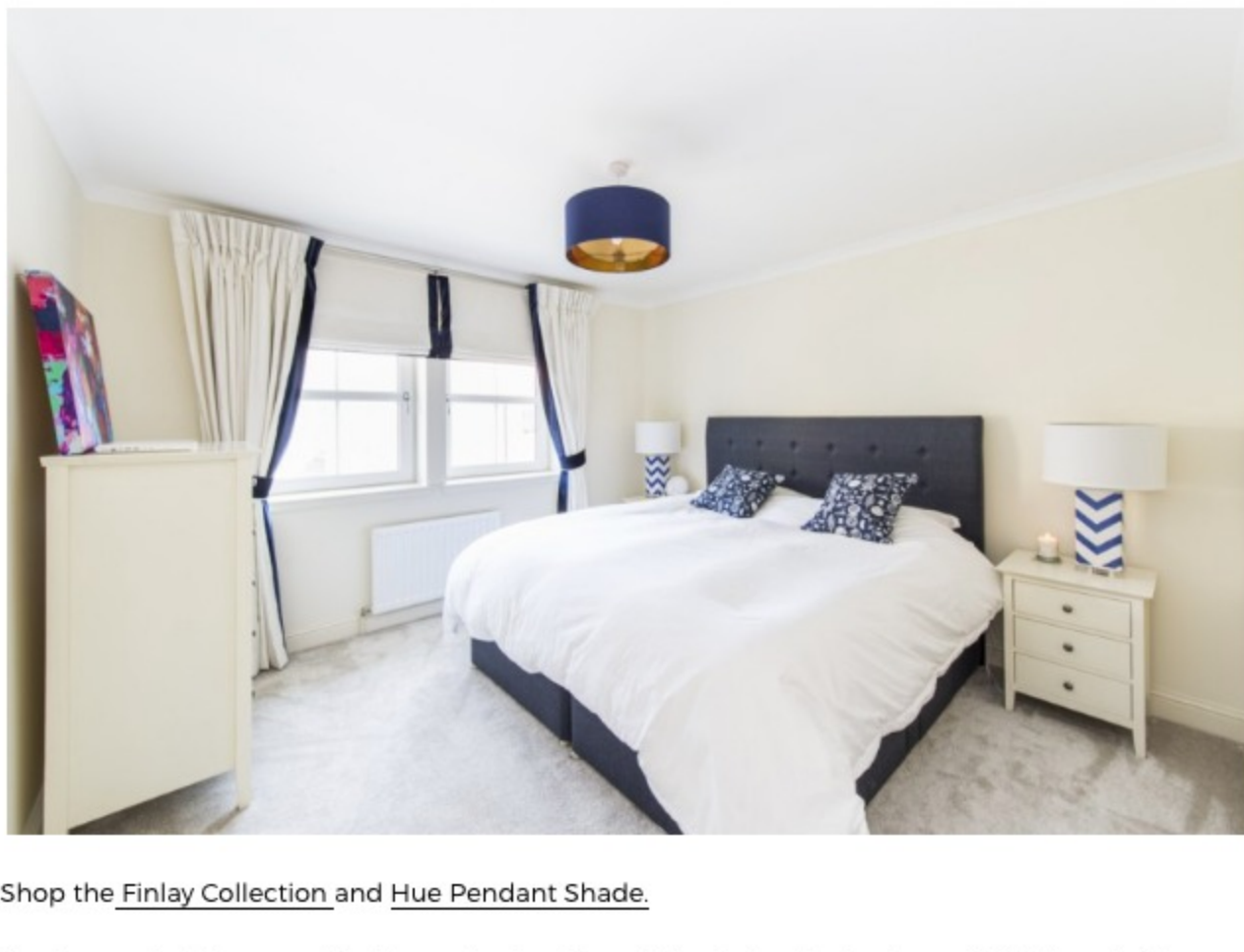
### Multiple accent chairs
